#### **I. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans**

My scientific work focuses on sports and body culture during the British Mandate period and especially after the establishment of the State of Israel. The main aim of my work

is to boost the status of sports as a legitimate field of scientific research. Sports affects many aspects of our lives beyond mere physical exercise. Almost every person is involved in sports in some way: watching sporting events, engaging in amateur or professional sports, buying sportswear, and more. The field of sports has a cultural component that influences our lifestyle and is also influenced by our social reality. These social and cultural aspects of sports are a significant focus of my scientific work.

Sports constitutes a social and cultural microcosm that may reflect broad and complex social processes extending far beyond their specific field. I believe that research on body culture in general, and on sports in particular, can help reveal social patterns that until now have been hidden or unrecognized and that can shed light on broad social systems. Through sports, we can zoom in on social phenomena and historical processes that may elude us in a more general view.

Sports research about the formative years of the state is lacking. Israeli historiography in the field of sports has pointed to the *Yishuv* period as the constitutive era of national body culture. My research in recent years has identified other factors that have shaped Israeli body culture. I found that body culture did not merely develop vertically along the axis of time. Every culture is influenced by and influences foreign cultures as well. Horizontal movement marked by migrating cultures and their influence on local body culture constitutes an integral part of forming a national cultural identity in general and a national body culture in particular. Israel is a state made up of immigrants who have had an influence on every field of endeavor, including body culture. Alongside ongoing trends since the *Yishuv* period, the Israeli public has been exposed to new physical practices that are not always consistent with the notion of muscular Jews in the spirit of Max Nordau's Zionist philosophy and do not always express the politically engaged Israeli ethos.

My research aims to add to and enrich perspectives on Israeli body culture and to expand knowledge regarding the factors that have influenced the development of Israeli sports. To this end, I examine encounters between immigrant and Israeli body culture during the first through third decade of Israeli statehood. Some of these encounters were characterized by cultural symbiosis in that they influenced both the immigrant and the local body cultures. Other such encounters kindled cultural clashes that aroused public debate over the emerging nature of Israeli body culture and the role of sports in Israeli society. The significance attributed to

sports during the years covered by my research goes beyond the narrow field of physical activity. Sports symbolizes and helps disseminate values that are sacred to Israeli society. Therefore, these types of encounters reflect Israeli society's attitudes toward values represented by immigrant body cultures during Israel's formative years.

Over the past two years, I have expanded the scope of my research on Israeli body culture by examining football players who migrated from Israel, US Jewry's support for Israeli sports, the use of sports to promote Israeli diplomacy in African countries, and more. These and other studies exemplify my use of sports as an instrument for understanding Israeli society. I have also sought to expand my field of research to consider body culture in its broader sense. For example, I conducted studies on the first Israeli circus, on superstitions in sports, on the Harlem Globetrotters' visit to Israel in 1955, on how radiophonic morning exercises were used to disseminate body culture to the public, and on the Sports Award (Ot Hasport) project. Taking a different tack, I also researched the background leading up to the murder of 11 members of the Israeli team at the Munich Olympics. All of these studies shed light on Israel society and the challenges it faces and may also indicate the directions of its future development.

My recent publications include two books. *HaAskuna (The Wheelers and Dealers)*, published in 2019, examines leaders in Israeli sports between 1951 and 1996 and is the first study to discuss sports leadership in depth. My new book, *The Home Field: The First Two Formative Decades of Body Culture and Sport in Israel*, discusses body culture in the first two decades of the state. This book has been accepted for publication by Yad Ben-Zvi publishing house.

In the future I intend to enhance my research efforts to include an in-depth examination of the factors that have shaped Israeli body culture. For example a historical examination of the self-image of the Israeli athlete and of what it means to be "an Israeli athlete." I intend to examine the challenges Israeli athletes have faced from the establishment of the state to the current day, the values they have been taught, and the national tasks with which they have been charged.
